#### Cause of Damage:

Struck a part of huge island of ice which lay under water, 50 leagues (approximately 150 or 240 kms) off the Newfoundland coast. Berg of prodigious height. Bore off and very soon after struck the same or another island of ice.

#### **Damage Description:**

Leaking after first impact, sank quickly after second. 14 Crew took to boats and made St. John's in 7 days by which time 5 had perished. Another 6 died soon after. Treby, one of 3 survivors, had both legs amputated and wrote the account.
