#### Cause of Damage:

Convoy encountered a berg 4,500 x 3,300 x 50 feet in fog, probably an area of mixed icebergs and field ice stretching right across the whole front of the convoy. Perhaps as many as 4 ships collided with or encountered ice and a further 18 collided with each other in the confusion. ship hit berg; 19 ships collided with each other.

#### **Damage Description:**

5 ships which collided with each other were badly damaged enough to require docking. The ones that apparantly hit ice or icebergs were:

SS Samuastral, freight Liberty ship en route St. John, NB -slight damage.

SS Samoland, same type as Samaustral, en route Sydney and Quebec - slight damage hit growler. M/S. Sunetta. La Corona Dutch tanker. probably Shell. b.1935 grt. 12.248 en route New York - touched
