Cause of Damage:

As part of Convoy HX 229A from New York to UK and routed near Greenland, vessel struck a berg at night in a snow storm while trying to round it approx. 100 miles S of Cape Farewell in early morning of 19 March

Damage Description:

Vessel was badly holed in the quarter and had to shut down engines but remained afloat. HMS Hastings was detailed to stand by and two rescue tugs were ordered in with orders for life saving only and not to tow. The two U.S rescue ships arrived at dusk the following day and drew alongside the tanker but cast of again as it got darker. No crew was lifted as the captain appeared insistent that the vessel be towed. A gale sprang up that night and the Svend Fovn suddenly began to sink and the vessels were called back.
